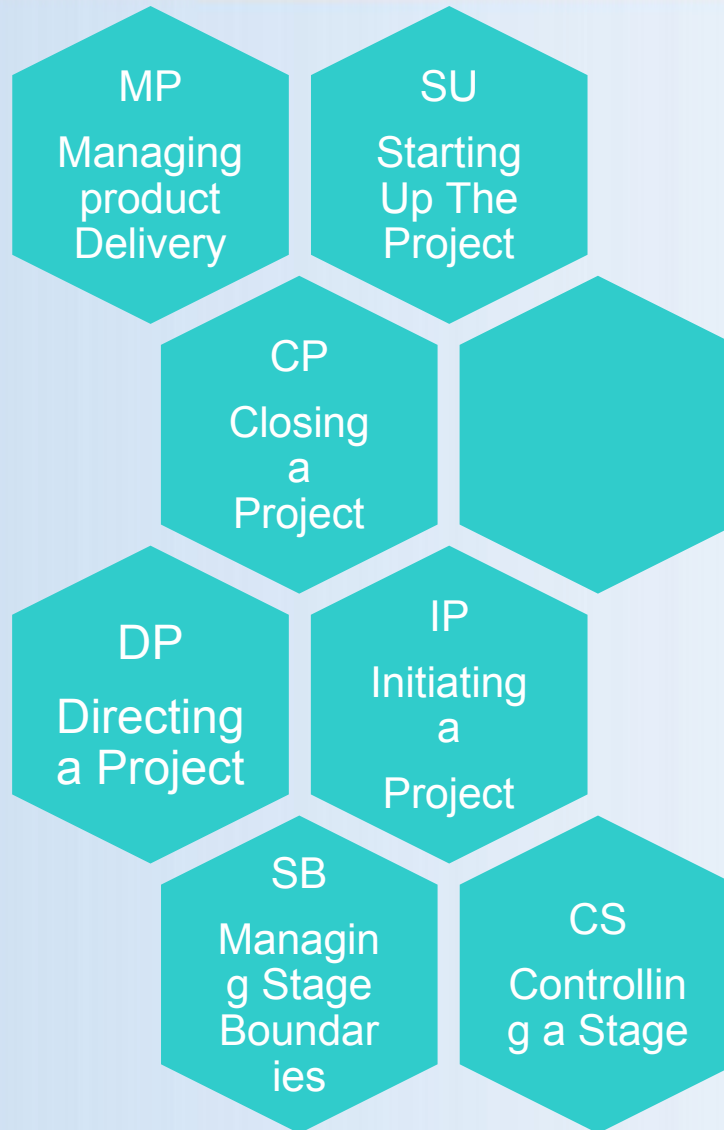


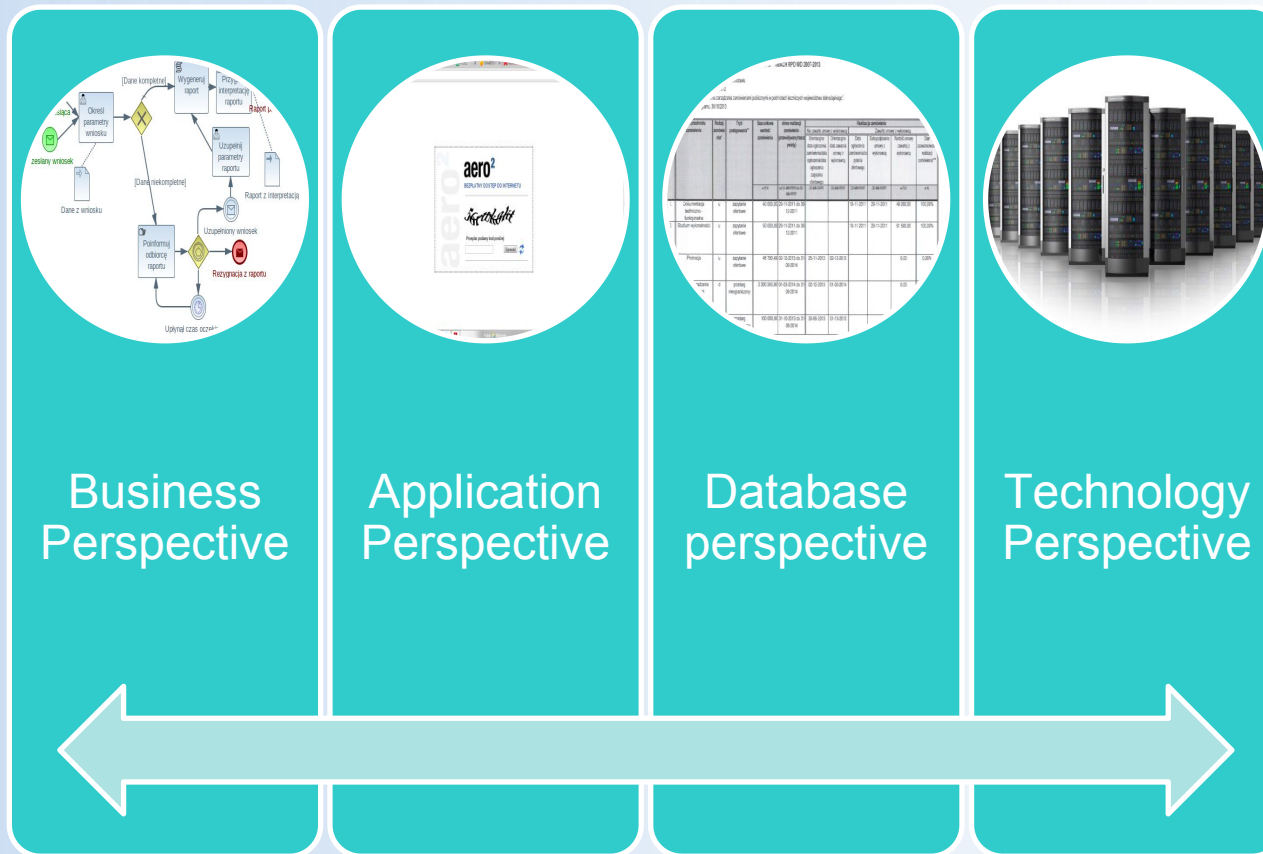

# Why do IT project fail?



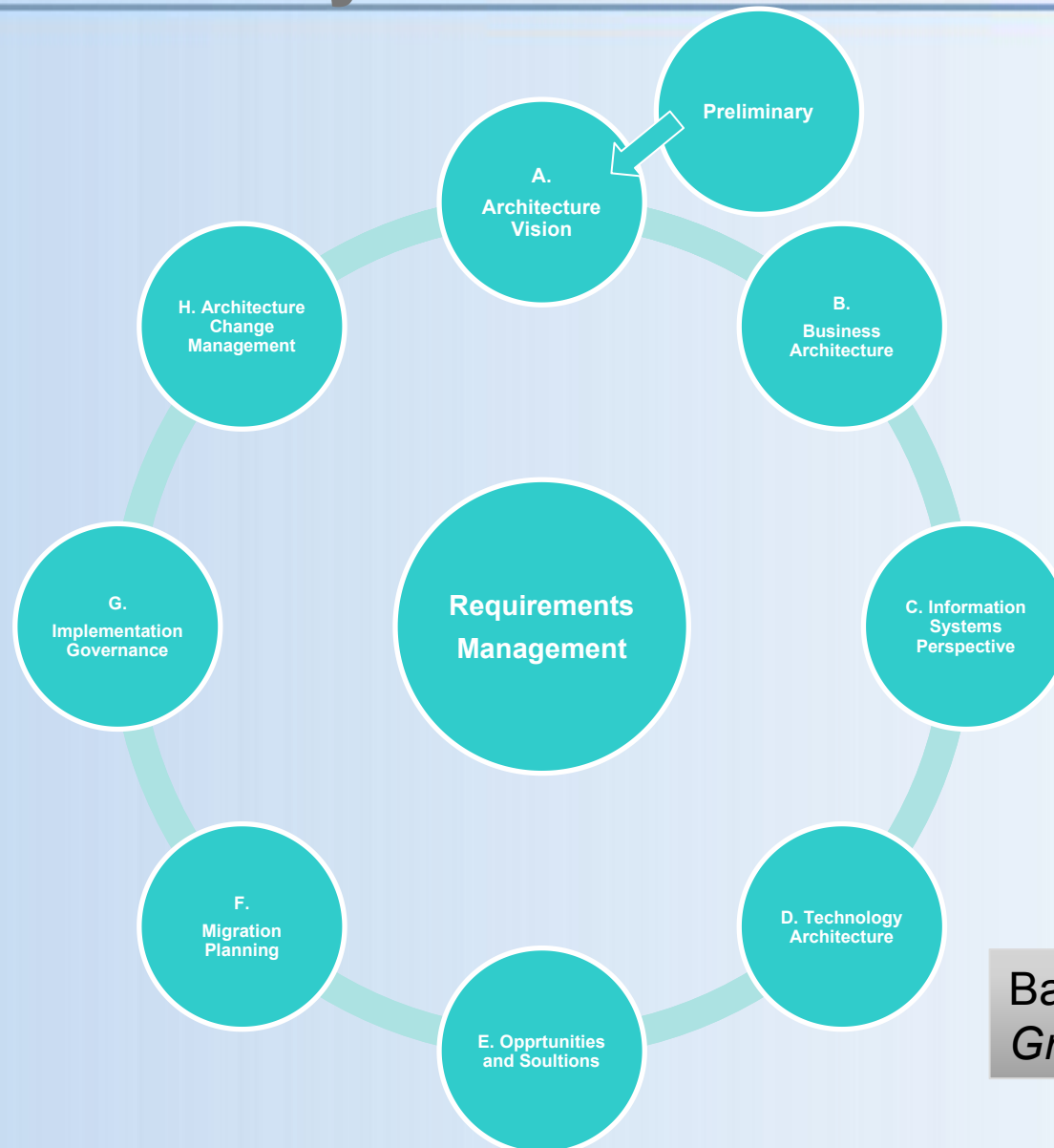
- Objectives and the products (results) of the project
- Criteria for product acceptance by the customer
- Strategic management
- Lack of support from management for the ongoing project
- Failure to apply the methodology of project management
- Economic justification either absent or insufficient
- Excessive optimism in planning the use of resources
- Excessive bureaucracy
- No common sense
- Lack of appropriate control instruments project and improper their use
- No change management system
- Errors in planning activities that will constitute the project



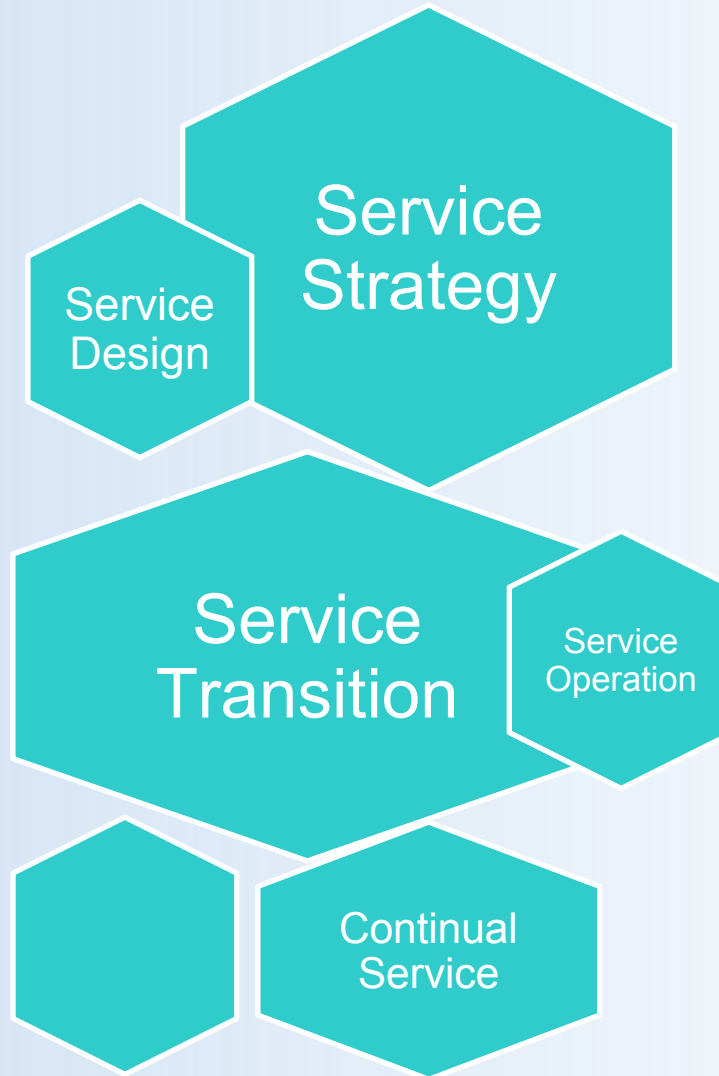

# Architecture Development Method Cycle



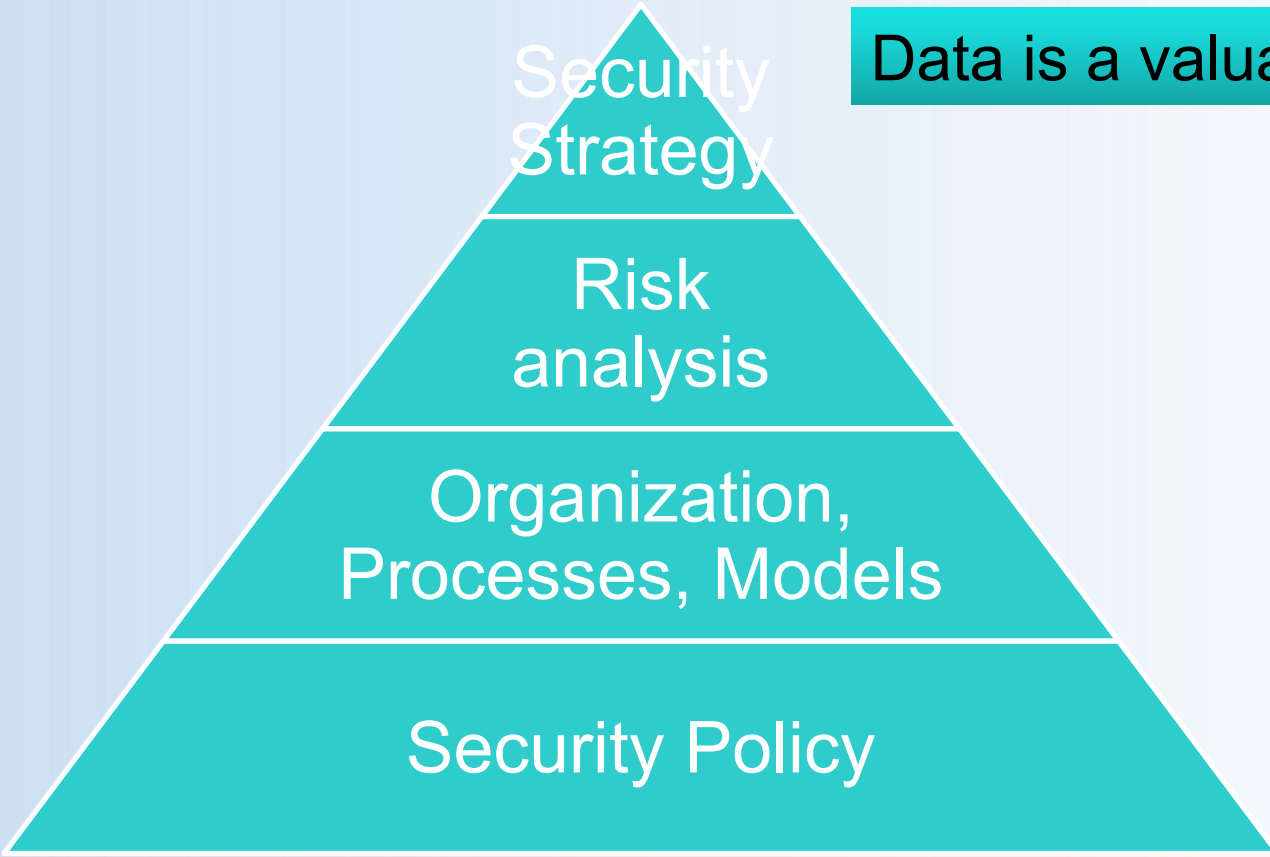
